- **The Jazz Cafe**: - One of Ubud's top nightspots, this lively cafe also serves very good quality food both lunch

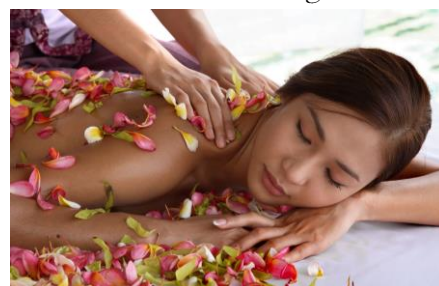

Bali is renowned for its terrific and inexpensive shopping, including clothing, leather, CD's, DVD's, Playstation/Xbox games, watches, shoes, silver, and paintings to name a few.

- **Money** – ATM's are readily available. Be very careful when changing your money. Always check the rate of exchange and commission (if any). Most importantly, always count your money before you leave the premises.



- **Outdoor Activities** – There is a plethora of activities one can choose from when in Bali including mountain cycling, elephant safaris, white water rafting, Waterbom Park, Finns Beach Club, jungle trekking and Bali Hai Cruises
- **Security** – Bali is a wonderful friendly place but do watch your handbag, money etc. Some of the kids in Kuta are little experts at opening bum bags, wallets etc. The point here (or anywhere) is to be careful.
- **Transport** – Take taxis with a meter rather than negotiate a cheap rate in an

old car.

- **Water From Bottles Only** – Unless specified that the water has been purified – **don't drink tap water in Bali**. Most major resorts/hotels have their own purification systems and supply you with clean bottled water in your room. Bottled water is safe, cheap and available everywhere.
- **Extra tips** –



- **Don't** swim outside designated swimming areas. Currents can be very strong so swim between red and yellow flags.
 - **Don't** touch people's head – it is disrespectful to Hindus.
 - **Don't** forget to smile back. Balinese are one of the friendliest people you would come across!
 - **Don't** enter a temple during menstruation. Sorry ladies!
 - **Don't** step on offerings (walk around them).
 - **Don't** forget to put on loads of waterproof sun cream (especially if you intend to spend a lot of time in the water).
 - **Don't** worry too much about ice – it's government quality controlled in established bars and restaurants.
- **Don't** forget to look and listen while crossing the road. Cars may stop, motorbikes may not!
 - **Don't** do drugs, it could lead to death penalty.
